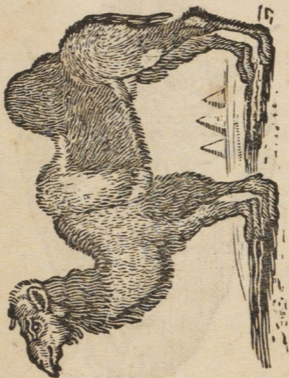

THE DEER.

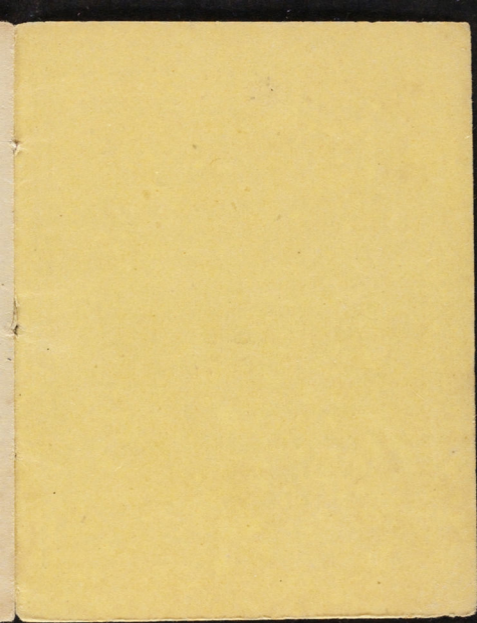
THE deer is a fine-looking animal. See what large horns he has. He can run very fast. He never hurts anybody. If the dogs run after him he runs
